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6.1 Management of Pathology Services

6.1.1 Standard

A medical director/head of department with appropriate registration, education and training provides oversight of the pathology activities of the organisation.

Standard Intent: Each organisation employs or otherwise obtains the services of a doctor who is accountable for oversight of the pathology activities that take place within the organisation. To accomplish these oversight responsibilities, the medical director/head of department must have training and experience related to forensic medicine/pathology services. The individual selected or appointed by the governing body to carry out these functions has the necessary qualifications as a histopathologist/forensic pathologist, forensic medical officer or medical practitioner qualified to perform post-mortem examinations and/or autopsies.

This includes liaison between the investigating officer of the police service and the forensic pathologist so as to maintain the chain of evidence relating to the body and any associated items.
